Changes made at Recycle Center

Auglaize County Solid Waste District Managing

The Cridersville Lions Club has stepped down from managing the recycle center in Tower Park. After more than 30 years the club felt they could no longer meet the needed requirements. Cridersville was one of the first communities in the area to offer recycling. Lion Dorance Thompson started it in the 1980's in the back of a semi trailer in the parking lot of Myers Pro Hardware on East Main Street. We thank everyone for their support over the years. The Auglaize County Solid Waste District will continue recycling efforts for residents. Dumpsters have been placed beside the building in Tower Park for mixed papers, cardboard, tin, aluminum, glass and plastics #1 & #2. A recent donation by the CVFD is has made it's way to the Royal St. Vincent and the Grenadines Fire & Police Force. With the assistance of the Rotary Club of Hoboken New Jersey a 1993 International Ambulance/Rescue Truck will be helping firefighters protect their communities. It's part of the Rotary's Medical Equipment and Supplies Abroad, MESA, program. 




